On Tuesday 18 May we are taking the whole school to Korokota Marae for a powhiri and to learn a little about the history of our area. We will be leaving school at 9.30am and returning by 2pm, travelling by bus. If you are able to help with supervision on the day that would be great. ANZAC DAY SERVICE:

Thank you to those families that supported the local ANZAC service at the Maungatapere Memorial Hall. The service was hosted by our senior students — well done Jamie Neumann, Stella McConachie and Santahna Simona who were supported by flag bearers. Suzi Saweirs a Y12 student from WGHS gave an excellent speech about the strength and sacrifice of those that fought.

REPORTING TO PARENTS

Our school has usually presented a hard copy portfolio report to parents at the end of the second term. Last year with COVID, the first half of the year was very disrupted and just a written report was sent home. This year we have decided to move to a digital portfolio rather than a hard copy. This will be sent to parents and whanau using the Seesaw app that many classes used during learning at home, and are still using to share learning with whanau. If you have not joined the app, information will be sent home from classrooms to help. During the term, teachers will share children's work via the parent portal. This will include reading, writing and maths work as well as other topic and class activities. While many teachers are already sharing group and class activities through Seesaw, these learning examples will be more specific to your own children and what they can do. These will only be shared to the whanau, not the whole class.

A written report will be send home with an information letter at the end of this term. This will provide information relating to key competencies and curriculum areas, as we have done previously.

As we develop our digital portfolio, samples of work will be shared during the first half and the second half of the year.

If parents want to build a digital portfolio of their children's learning, you can do this using the Seesaw app. **Monday 31**st **May will be a Teacher Only Day** to enable teachers to undertake their curriculum reporting.

WRITE THAT ESSAY PROGRAMME

All staff have been involved in professional development to teach writing in a very structured way. Next Wednesday, teachers will participate in zoom meetings at school to develop skills to teach students how to expand their ideas in their writing. Sentence trains are used to teach phrases, sentence types and sentence starters. They also teach surface features – capital letters, commas, full stops using the engines and carriages. These enable students to see the phrases they put together to write well.

OPEN/SHARING DAY

On Wednesday 30 June we are planning an open day for parents and grandparents to come in and share what students have been learning about. Students can share their learning with whanau as well as learn from them. Please note it in your diary.

RELATIONSHIPS AND SEXUALITY EDUCATION

We will be sharing information and a survey relating to the revised curriculum guidelines. This will be to inform our community what is in the guidelines for each area of the school and to get feedback about what is important to cover at our school. This will also lead into the puberty education programme running on 3rd & 4th June for Y6/7/8 pupils. The survey will include all levels of the school with the key learning revised by the Ministry of Education. These are guidelines, so we need to get guidance from our community about what is important.

Pyjama Day raised \$250 for SPCA last term. On Tuesday 25 May they will hold a Twin day (a perennial favourite), with funds raised going to the Starship Hospital. They are also holding a talent quest in the last couple of week of the term.


