Kia ora Parents and Whanau

The last fortnight has been busy with high school orientations, Greats & Grands day, junior and Y7/8 school athletics. #### **GREATS & GRANDS DAY**

The turnout of grandparents and whanau last Wednesday 20 November was huge. Our pupils shared some of their talents after the kapa haka roopu performed, and they visited classrooms. Well done on the many grandparents/whanau that got involved in classroom activities alongside their grandchildren, playing games, completing worksheets, reading and writing plus sharing work in the rooms. While the weather did begin to rain on us, we managed to get through before a heavy shower arrived. Our students really enjoyed hosting their families and sharing their school with them.

#### **SWIMMING POOL UPDATE AND COMMUNITY USE**

Our school pool has been repainted but unfortunately it is unlikely it will be finished in time to start swimming this year. Once completed the paint needs to cure, then refilled and balanced.

Our Board of Trustees does open the pool for community use during the summer and we know this is appreciated. However health and safety regulations make this harder and place greater risk on the school, so it is really important that we meet the regulations and families abide by the agreement they sign around safety. Regular daily monitoring of the pool water and treatment is required. This needs to happen even when Allan Frost our caretaker is on holiday and during some weekends. If you have the training to look after a pool, or are willing to assist please let our office know, as we will need someone to help cover for when our caretaker is away.

The cost for a key is \$50 for the season for those that have paid their school donation. Keys are available from Thursday 5 December but they need to be signed for by an adult. The pool isn't available for use by the community until 20 December when school finishes.

#### **FIRST AID TRAINING**

During the next week our Y0-6 classes will be participating in 2 first aid sessions with Mrs Jo King, who is now working as a school training officer for St Johns in the north. The sessions will cover Injury Prevention and Responding to an Emergency. We will also have a session from North Power for Y4-8 classes around electrical safety and appliances next Wednesday.

Junior Athletics were held on Wednesday 26 November in the afternoon. They completed a rotation that incorporated a variety of athletic skills, then participated in fun sprint races. The afternoon is about participation and having fun while learning run, jump and throw skills. There was an excellent turnout of family/ whanau support.


#### Y7/8 UNIFORMS






