#### **STAFF CHANGES**

#### **MATHS ACHIEVEMENT**

Assessments undertaken last term show 76% of our students are at or above in their numeracy knowledge and 72% in their strategy knowledge. There are groups of students throughout the levels who find maths difficult, and we have provided extra small group



teaching and teacher aide programmes for many of these students. Maths is sometimes one of those subjects that is inhibited by belief - it is really important that we do not impose our own limitations on our kids, and empower them with positive self-belief that they can do it. The ability to work out maths problems is often limited by the knowledge of basic facts and tables, so it is important that we do encourage children to learn these for quick and accurate recall. Playing games that involve adding and multiplication eg cards, board games, as well as demonstrating uses can help develop this.

#### **MAUNGATAPERE SCHOOL ENROLMENT ZONE**

The process for families living outside our school zone and wishing to enrol students is getting underway. Places available will be notified on 31 August and information will be on the school website. We would also like families who have children within our school zone starting school next year to let us know. Notification of new families to our school next year also helps with our future planning. We do have a record of siblings but not of new families who will be starting next year.

#### **NETBALL UNIFORMS & PRIZE GIVING**

The staggered end of the netball season is completed this week, with the Intermediate grades playing their last game. 


